Rabba Yaffa Epstein is the Senior Scholar and Educator-in-Residence at The Jewish Education Project. Epstein has served as faculty for Yeshivat Maharat, the Drisha Institute, Moishe House, the Nahum Goldmann Fellowship, Hillel: The Foundation for Jewish Campus Life, JPro, Jewish Federations of North America, and Limmud events around the globe. She is a member of the inaugural cohort of the Sefaria Word-by-Word Jewish Women's Writing Circle. In 2024, Epstein received the prestigious Covenant Foundation Award, recognizing her outstanding contributions to the field of Jewish education. She received Orthodox Rabbinic Ordination from Yeshivat Maharat, and received an additional Orthodox Ordination from Rabbi Daniel Landes, holds a Law Degree from Bar-Ilan University, and has studied at the Advanced Talmud Institute at Matan, as well as the Talmud Department at Hebrew University.
