After growing up in the Five Towns of Long Island and studying in a yeshiva day school, Adam continued his Jewish education receiving a B.A. in Bible from the Jewish Theological Seminary and a B.A. in Religion from Columbia University. With a love of and dedication to learning, teaching, and experiencing Jewish texts, rituals, and life, Adam continued on to receive a Certificate of Jewish education at the Shalom Hartman Institute in Jerusalem. While living in Israel, Adam received rabbinic ordination from Yeshivat Pirchei Shoshanim and studied Safrut (scribal arts) under the tutelage of Rabbi David Gottesman. Following his time living in Israel, Adam worked as an experiential Jewish educator and classroom teacher designing and implementing courses and experiential school-wide programming at a day school in New Jersey. After a short time owning and operating a kosher BBQ food truck, Adam moved to Miami and launched Base Miami (a community program using his home as a pluralistic rabbinic resource and central meeting place for Jewish learning and life). Adam received ordination as a spiritual director through Aleph's Hashpaah program. With a pluralistic perspective spanning the Jewish denominational spectrum and a deep respect for the Jewish halachic/legal framework, Adam teaches, guides, and mentors individuals exploring conversion to Judaism through his work with Project Ruth. Adam is currently the VP Program for OneTable helping individuals cultivate a personal shabbat practice.
